### ROSÉ CRUSH

Combine **3 ounces (6 tablespoons) rosé wine**, **1 1/2 ounces (3 tablespoons) orange juice**, and **1 1/2 ounces (3 tablespoons) cranberry juice** in an ice-filled shaker. Strain into an ice-filled glass. Garnish with **cranberries, raspberries**, and **mint**, if desired. Makes 1 cocktail.

## Sausalito’s New Seafood Sanctuary

The recent opening of Barrel House Tavern is just one more reason to hop a ferry from San Francisco to Sausalito, a once-sleepy fishing village that is now among the Bay Area’s hottest destinations for innovative cuisine. The restaurant’s historic waterfront location was formerly the first terminal for ferries traveling to and from San Francisco before the Golden Gate Bridge was built. Barrel House owner Chris Henry converted the space into an airy, modern eatery: The 20-foot-high curved ceiling was restored with reclaimed curly maple and sunny skylights, and walls of glass open to views of city lights twinkling on the bay—one of the best seats in town.

At the raw bar, fresh West Coast oysters are served on ice, as are many of the barrel-aged cocktails and handcrafted sodas made

with flavors such as pear, vanilla, lavender, and even bacon.

The dinner menu is a California-meets-Mediterranean mélange: Tender Dungeness crab stuffs the sliders; shrimp and heirloom tomatoes combine in sweet, velvety bisque. Once you’ve scraped your plate clean, you’ll notice the tableware from Heath Ceramics, known for its distinctive glazes. (The pottery studio is just down the road if you want to take a slice of Sausalito home with you.)

“I grew up in Sausalito and used to fish and go crabbing along the water with my father,” says Henry. “My mom would make great crab rolls and cioppino from our catch.” You may find Mom’s fish stew on the menu—it’s seasonal—along with other specialties sourced from nearby farms and fisheries; barrelhousetavern.com. —Susan C. Kim
